- According to a recent survey, 2.4 million visitors experienced agritourism at California's ranches and farms in 2008, and practioners say the numbers have soared since then.

- Increased exposure for your core activities, be they a farm stand, Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) boxes, a crafting center, or your farmhouse B&B.
- Additional profit center Many farmers are fining that adding one or two additional activities to their farm routine, that generate new income from agritourism can make a big difference in financially sustaining your farm.
- The USDA Awards Over \$52 million in Grants to Grow Organic and Local Food Economies
- The USDA has authorized most of these grants through:
 - Agricultural Act of 2014 (the 2014 Farm Bill)
 - including the Agricultural Marketing Service's (AMS),
 - Farmers Market Promotion Program and Local Foods Promotion Program,
 - and the National Institute of Food and Agriculture's (NIFA) Organic Research and Extension Initiative (OREI) and Community Food Projects (CFP) grant program.
